- and instill in each student a sense of moral and spiritual values such that they will become a humane, concerned, involved, and thinking member of society.

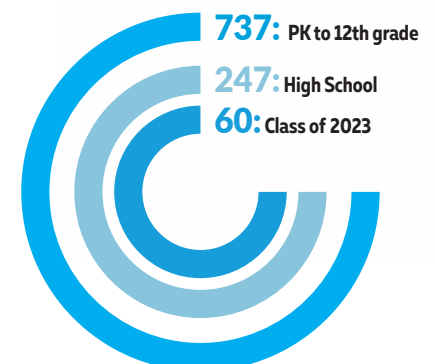
All this is to ensure an educationally sound and innovative future for our school as we move through the 21st century.
